Though the results of the campus department stunned us, we regretted that during the years of the pandemic, evidently we had to discontinue. We asked God to, once again, open up doors to this ministry.

While waiting, we worked along with nearby police precincts. We were allowed to minister to inmates through Bible studies every week. We are able to share testimonies, worship Jesus through singing, preach Christ, and then distribute boxed meals during our visits. Praise the Lord that during captivity, inmates were granted freedom from the bondage of sin. We hope that as we continue to disciple them, they will experience a genuine transformation in their lives.

WE ARE BACK TO SCHOOL!

It is wonderful that the police have also become our partners. To them, this may just be a simple operation. But for us, it is a channel provided by God for them to also hear the gospel.

This school's quarter, our relationship with the police was what allowed us to get back in the campuses. Praise God! We are excited!

This mission works in collaborative efforts of the ODBC, Philippine National Police, and two elementary school principals. As we started, volunteers came together to reach out to students from two campuses. At the first school, we distributed booklets (to more than 4000 students) which told about God's wonderful plan of salvation; while we taught 1200 students at another school (for 30 minutes in each classroom) about God's saving grace. It was beautiful to see so many students claiming Christ as their Lord. There are follow-up lessons in the school every Friday until the end of the school year. We hope that out of this, the Lord would enable more young people to grow and that His Word be expanded in our city in the future.
