A Note from Pastor Damon

Dear Victory Family of Faith,

Being a part of something that has an important mission can be overwhelming to us to begin with. There can be challenges that can cause us to feel inadequate for the mission we have been asked to do. However, it is extremely satisfying when we are committed to seeing the work through until its completion. That can be very stressful if we are trying to complete the mission with our own wisdom and power. For example, Jesus said in Act 1:8, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. Paul was certainly one to look to see how God empowered him for the work God had ordained for him to walk in. Paul said, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me," (Philippians 4:13). Paul was a true minister of the gospel; he had a mission to declare the Kingdom of God to the Jew first and then to the Greek (Gentiles). Paul had a full and fruitful mission; it was not empty or ineffective. Paul preached boldly even in opposition to the gospel of Christ. Paul stood boldly; he did not become discouraged. Paul knew God had called him, and no matter the circumstances he continued to preach the gospel boldly. Paul preached to please God, not men. Not all people want to hear the gospel. However, he knew God would take care of him and bless the mission to which he was called. Like Paul, we are to proclaim the Word of God to please God, not men.

Paul never preached for glory, it belonged to God. Nor did he preach for prestige, or for authority of position. He was not out to be recognized as a great preacher or good minister. He was on mission and the only thing that would stop the mission was his own death. He was tender, loving, caring an affectionate. His affection for the people was so strong that he preached the gospel to them in the midst of adversity and opposition. Paul lived an unblameable life before God and man. He understood that without hearing the message there would be no hope for the world. Paul said in, 1 Corinthians 1:21 "For after that in the wisdom of God the world by wisdom knew not God, it pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe." For almost 2000 years, Paul's comment to the call God called him too, has given millions the opportunity to hear the message of Christ and believe on Him for eternal life. Not of Paul, but of Christ.

If we were to examine our own commitment of sharing the gospel to others,

would the world still be being influenced 2000 years from now, (continued)

because we were on mission. During our time God has given us, at this time in history, if everyone shares the good news of Christ like I do, how well would the gospel impact the world? Did you know that ninety-five percent of believers never share the good news with others, even to their own family and friends. I have chosen for our memory passage for this month is (Romans 10:14-15) "How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? ...(15) And how shall they preach, except they be sent? as it is written, How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!" Wouldn't you love to have beautiful feet to God. Wouldn't you love to have the passion as Paul. We are equipped to be like Paul, we have the same Lord, the same Spirit, and the same call to carry the gospel. Will we answer our call, that is the question? I hope we all stay on mission for our Lord.





April Bible Reading

This month we will learn the Scripture together by reading the same section daily for the entire month. This will enable us to know what is in that book or section and will strengthen our ability to stand during times of trials and temptations. Please join us as we read Chapters 11-15 in the book of Jeremiah. If each week we read and meditate on these chapters, then read the entire selection during the weekend, it will increase our knowledge of the Scriptures and strengthen our walk with Christ.

Jesus' 7 Last Sayings in Scripture

In order of the Gospels, these seven statements can be found in Matthew/Mark (1), Luke (3), and John (3). But in order of timing, these seven statements typically appear as follows:

- "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34) (Forgiveness)
- "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise." (Luke 23:43) (Salvation)
- "My God, My God, why has thou forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46; Mark 15:34) (Abandonment)
- "Woman, behold, your son ... Behold, your mother!" (John 19:26-27) (Compassion)
- "I thirst." (John 19:28) (Suffering)
- "It is finished." (John 19:30) (Triumph)
- "Father, into your hands I commit my Spirit." (Luke 23:46) (Reunion)

Together, these seven words do not say everything about Christ's cross, but they come close. By looking at them we see Jesus' life was not stolen from him or cut short from its full potential. Rather, Jesus used every last breath of his God-ordained life to finish the work God gave him before the foundation of the world. And by looking at his words, we learn much about who Christ is and what his cross means for us.
